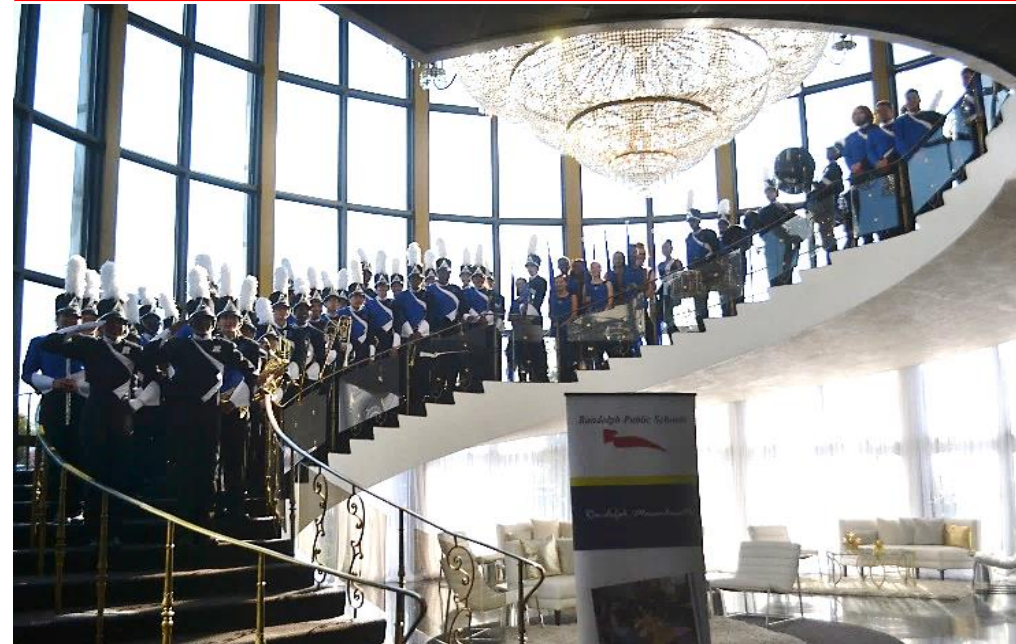

Student Expectations

A. OBJECTIVE FOR THE STUDENT: PROVIDE STUDENTS WITH BASIC KNOWLEDGE AND CONCEPTUAL FRAMEWORKS OF GLOBALIZATION AND GLOBAL STUDIES

- Develop students' ability to critically analyze complex global issues
- Equip students with necessary international perspectives and communicative competencies
- Demonstrate an understanding of cultural values and beliefs other than their own
- Demonstrate exemplary writing skills as well as skill sets necessary for intercultural communication
- Integrate the study of world language with discipline-based content
- Learn of international study and career opportunities in government, business and education

B. PROJECT-BASED LEARNING

- Independent and group projects created to cultivate students' ability to recognize the links between the economic, political and cultural entities that are transforming individuals and organizations

C. LEARNING EXPEDITIONS

- Participate in standards-based curricular travel
- Students collaboratively and independently research and experience authentic living conditions, interact with local people and engage in service learning

D. LOGISTICS

- Target number of students 20-25 per year / 100 max for the program
- Students apply at the end of 7th grade
- Students will be exposed in grades 6-8:
 1. Enrolled in World Language
 2. Enrolled in a more intense, challenging curriculum on global issues
 3. 8th grade students enrolled in three high school courses during the school day

Program Overview and Requirements:

Diploma of Distinction

- 120 community service hours
- Four Advanced Placement courses in grades 10-12
- World Language: 5 years (starting in grade 8)

Capstone Project

- Senior year presentation (can be a team of 3 students)

Internship (after-school or in the summer)

- Located at an organization or political office (focusing on international issues)

Education Travel Experience

- Students will complete an educational travel experience

Students will be Exposed to Speakers

- Series of speakers from businesses /international related organizations

Courses: Required Core (will satisfy MA State requirements)

- English (AP Literature, AP Language)
- Social Studies (AP World, AP US History)
- Math: Economics, Statistics (Calculus and AP-level courses will be encouraged)
- Science: Higher level courses (i.e., Physics, Anatomy and Physiology)
- 2-4 electives focusing on communication, international business and global issues
